Memories and Transmissions of Performance and Contemporary Dance Works

Directed by Anne Bénichou, with contributions by Marc Boivin, Ginelle Chagnon, and Theresa Rowat

The Fondation Jean-Pierre Perreault and the Institut du patrimoine at the Université du Québec à Montréal are pleased to invite you to a three-day conference on memories and transmission of performance and contemporary dance works on 2, 3, and 4 May 2013, at the Cinémathèque québécoise. Entrance is free of charge.

Twenty theoreticians and professionals, both national and international, from both art disciplines – performance and contemporary dance – will meet to discuss the conceptions and practices of preservation and transmission specific to these fields.

As ephemeral, multidisciplinary art practices that involve the body, produced in the perspective of a relationship with an audience, contemporary dance and performance seem to require specific modes of memory and transmission, based both on the archive (transmissions via traces and documents) and on oral and corporeal memory (direct transmissions from one body to another, based on oral tradition). How can we consider the articulation of the archive and the memory, of documentation and reprise, of recording and live presentation, at both the theoretical and pragmatic levels? What institutions, infrastructure, or practices can implement this double register of transmission? What forms of historical accounts have resulted?

Artists, archivists, dancers, choreographers, curators, documentary filmmakers, documentalists, historians and theoreticians of art and dance, museologists, performers, and rehearsal directors will discuss their experiences and ideas in six thematic sessions: Re-creating Live Performance; Photographic and Filmic Spaces; Activating the Archive; Constructing the Archive; Oral Traditions: Direct Transmission; Writing the Histories of the Living Arts.

The conference is the result of a partnership between the Fondation Jean-Pierre Perreault and the Institut du patrimoine at the Université du Québec à Montréal. The Fondation Jean-Pierre Perreault is dedicated to promoting, documenting, and transmitting Quebec's heritage of contemporary dance choreography. The Institut du patrimoine at UQAM brings together professors and research teams whose scholarly interest includes objects of material and immaterial heritage and the processes involved in creating heritage. The institute is pursuing a tradition of partnership with the field in research and offering expertise on subjects dealing with heritage.
